Looking to supplement your scholarship funds? Try these resources!

Even with only a few semesters left at MSU, you may find you need to lay your hands on more funds to help you get to the finish line. Great news! There are more opportunities for FREE MONEY out there than you may know. Check out these:

- **Cat Scholarships** You must have your [FAFSA](#) submitted for all these scholarships so make sure that is done. Then, search all the opportunities by keyword until you find something that may work for you. Be aware that February 1, 2023 is the deadline for most of the scholarships.
- **Award Montana** Administered by the Montana University System, these are a variety of exchange programs, scholarships, and waivers.
- Talk to your advisor or a favorite professor about opportunities that may be available through your department or college.

HINT: Many departments and college also have internship and employment opportunities available - don't be afraid to talk to staff and faculty about these.

HOW TO PAY FOR
GRAD SCHOOL?

Whether you are graduating in two weeks or two years, if you are thinking about furthering your education, now is a great time to seriously think about how to pay for it.

When you become a grad student, you leave behind the days of Pell Grants and other funds you relied upon in your undergraduate days. But that doesn't mean you have to go it alone - there are plenty of resources for you to mine here at MSU, as well as other state and national resources.

- Your first step should be [MSU's Graduate School](#) and their [Funding & Fellowship Opportunities for Graduate Students](#) webpage. Here you will find opportunities that both you and your department can initiate. **Take some time to dive into this information and see what can apply to you, your situation, and your program of study.**
- You can also find a list of possible fellowships you can apply for and how you can sign up for the [SPIN Funding Service](#), which is the "world's largest database of sponsored funding opportunities."

- Talk to the department hosting your program and the faculty you will have. **Personal contacts and networks are priceless when it comes to getting TA positions and letters of reference for grants and fellowships.**
- Look into [accelerated and online programs](#) at MSU so you'll spend less time and money earning your degree.
- Make an [appointment with a financial coach](#) at the [Office of Financial Education](#) to discuss more options and to get tips on saving and budgeting NOW for future grad programs.
