## **MSU Extension MontGuides and Resources**

- 1. <u>Designating a Beneficiary through Contractual Arrangements</u> (MSU Extension MontGuide) Focuses on transferring assets through contractual arrangements, such as those commonly found with insurance policies, individual retirement accounts, and employee benefit plans.
- 2. Dying Without a Will in Montana: Who Receives Your Property (MSU Extension MontGuide): Includes legal terms and detailed examples of possible scenarios for distribution of property should a person die before writing a will.
