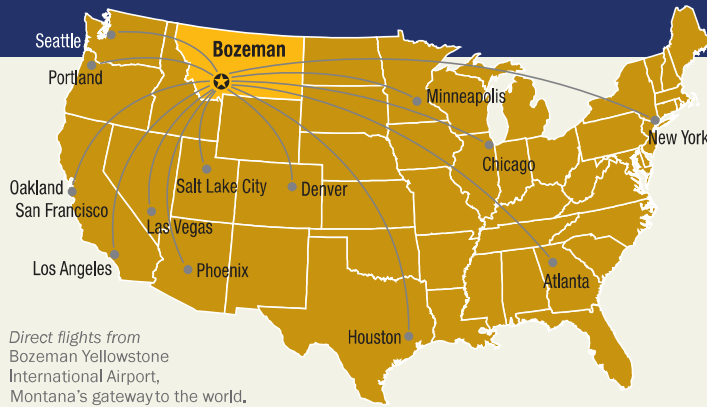

Graduate Requirements

- GPA 3.0/4.0
- TOEFL iBT 80, IELTS 6.5, PTE 54
- All university transcripts
- Three letters of recommendation
- Application fee \$60
- Statement of Purpose
- GRE or GMAT
- A completed application: montana.edu/gradschool

UNDERGRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

Merit Based Scholarship (No SAT is required)

Applied to both freshman and transfer applicants with GPA 2.5+/4.0

\$5,000 - \$12,000

International Bobcat Alumni Scholarship

Applied to both freshman and transfer who have had immediate family members (parents or siblings) graduate from MSU or who are currently enrolled at MSU. One-time offer for the first semester.

\$ 2,000

Presidential Scholarship

For top freshman applicants who have been admitted for Fall semester. Full tuition waiver & stipend for four years. Separate application required and must be submitted by November 30

Up to \$29,000

Note: Merit-based scholarship can be renewed annually if the student maintains a 3.0+/4.0 GPA, maintains a full-time student status, and remains a non-resident student.

GRADUATE SCHOLARSHIPS

International Deans Fellowship

Dean's International Scholarship is a 1-credit tuition waiver applied to the first term. The waiver is only applied when no other funding from the university. Students are eligible if they bring an international perspective to face-to-face graduate programs. No application is required.
